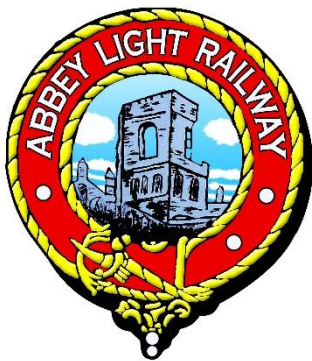




Abbey Light Railway

Exhibition model railway

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Based in East Devon, but exhibition invites from further afield considered.



The Abbey Light Railway was a small 2' gauge line in Leeds on which I used to volunteer. The layout is built to 1:43.5 (British O scale) and uses home-made 14mm gauge track to accurately depict 2' gauge.

The rolling stock represents the real fleet of mostly ex-industrial diesels. They range from heavily modified kits to fully scratch built, usually making use of 3D printing technology.

Layout details

Length - 12', all viewing area.

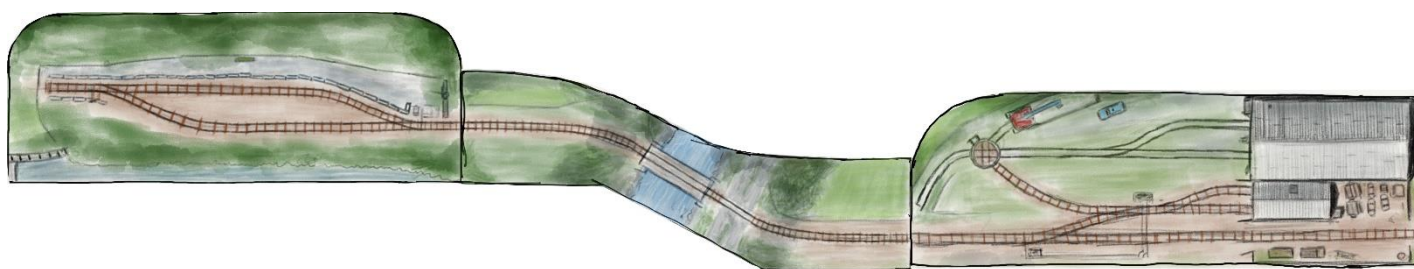
Depth - 2' total. At least 4' operating area is also required behind this.

Power requirement - 1x 13amp domestic power supply.

Operators - 2, requiring lunch each day of the exhibition. Overnight accommodation (twin room) and breakfast may also be required depending on distance from home and duration of the show.

Transport – Own car. Fuel expense required.

The layout is free-standing and self-illuminated. No barriers required.
